
I am convinced that the MFC has the solutions to these challenges. To tackle them head-on, we must build capacity.

What we do

We provide assessment and treatment for language, communication and learning differences.

Assessment

To observe, measure and describe a child's strengths and challenges to determine what their learning needs are, if any.

Treatment

Individual and group settings, virtual or inperson sessions to help a child learn by practicing and expanding on skills in a positive, engaging way.

Knowledge Exchange

Workshops, training, mentoring and knowledge-exchange to better equip parents and clinicians to help children and youth.



Our **PARTNERSHIPS** with Indigenous communities allow us to share our expertise while respecting the culture and responding to the needs within the various communities.

Did you know?

The Covid-19 pandemic hit Indigenous communities particularly hard. To fill the gap in services the MFC provides:



- Psycho-educational assessments (both virtually and on-site at schools outside of Montreal and in remote communities)
- Speech language screeners
- Treatment goals and monitors student progress
- Training to speech aides working in the community so that they can provide therapy to their population
- Explicit teaching of narrative skills to kindergarten and grade one students

Narrative Project

Telling stories is a powerful tool because it forges connections among people, and between people and ideas. Stories help convey the culture, history and values that unite us. For children, storytelling is very important for their social, emotional, and cognitive development, especially for communication and literacy skills. This program helps to develop narrative structure to all the students in the class with or without learning disabilities. Research shows that narrative skills are a predictor of academic success.

Louise and Alan Edwards Foundation

Our donors make everything we do possible! For over twenty years, the Louise & Alan Edwards Foundation has been a key supporter, partner, and all-around champion of the MFC and its mission. It is not an exaggeration to say they are at the core of the Centre's success as a learning and communication leader in our community.

Because of their generous gifts, thousands of children have been helped through our Taylor Adolescent Program (TAP.) The result – a graduation rate higher than the provincial average for high school and CEGEP students instead of dropping out. And hundreds of families have received bursaries to help cover the costs of assessments and treatments. The result – more families getting help for their children before it is too late, instead of waiting on lists in the public system.

The Foundation was established in 2000 by philanthropist and proud Montrealer Alan Edwards. Today, his children Jane and Eric are carrying on his legacy.

Donors Want to Know

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: "Why aren't the MFC's assessments, treatment and programs free of charge?

A: Families play a key role in their children's growth, and it's important for them to be involved. We ask everyone to pay a small fee, which depends on various factors. This fee helps make sure everyone stays committed.

Q: "Is there a long waiting list?"

A: No. Typically, we are able to see a child in 3 months or less.

Q: "Who can apply for a bursary (a financial gift) to help cover the cost of services and programs?"

A: Any client of the MFC can apply for a bursary. The bursary program covers up to 50% of the cost of assessment and up to 75% of treatment. The amount of subsidy available varies according to family size and annual income. All information is kept confidential.



Q: Should I wait to see if the problem resolves itself or if the school takes care of it?

A: We encourage parents to follow up promptly: the sooner your child starts, the better!

Q: Who provides the money for the bursary fund?

A: Our Donors! Thanks to the wonderful support of the Louise and Alan Edwards Foundation and other generous donors, the Montreal Fluency Centre can offer financial assistance to families to assess and treat their children.
